








# Suburbs Within Cumberland Council Area

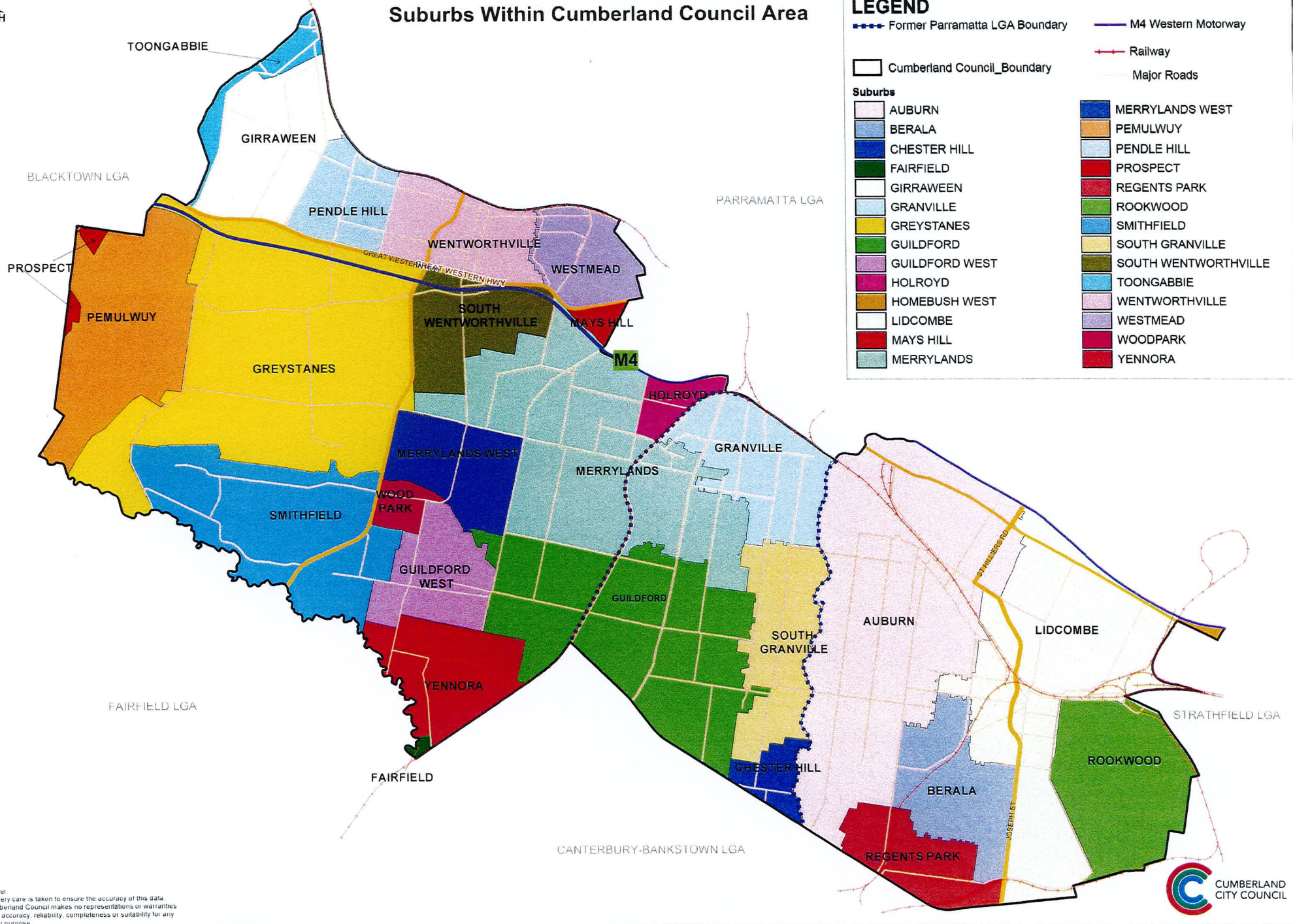

**Table A2.** Definitions for criteria used in cyclability index (Figure 9).

Indicator	Definition
<b>Safety</b>	
Road Type	This describes the type road access varying from cycleway, shared path, main roads, steps. Designated cycleway such as cycle bridge and tunnels are more likely to reduce the risk to cyclist safety.
Speed Limit	Lower speed limitation has a positive effect on cyclist safety if there is no designated cycleway
Road Crossing	Cycleways that intersect with other busy roads will increase the risk to safety when crossing the roads
Road connectivity	Measures the number of paths that connected with each road segment. This indicator represents the importance of the road segment in street network, where higher connectivity means the user is more likely to use this segment.
<b>Amenity</b>	
Transit Availability	The transit availability for each road is measured by the distance to a main transport facility like train station
Slope	Cyclists prefer flat route than hilly area
Point of Interests (Pols)	Point of Interests represents the location with lot of human activities including urban centres, public spaces and community hubs
Scenery	Scenery can shorten the perceived travel time, thus improve the comfortability of cycling. This includes the presence of green spaces and waterways along the cycle route.
