AAHMS post-hearing response: Portfolio Committee No. 2 – Health on 16 May 2022 for the Use of primates and other animals in medical research in NSW

Question on notice (pg 5)

Anthony Cunningham: I am not aware, but certainly on our campus we have phased out any research using cats and dogs.

The Hon. Emma Hurst: How long ago did you phase out the use of cats and dogs?

Anthony Cunningham: Look, I would need to take that on notice but it's over a decade.

Answer

I have inquired and am informed that the Western Sydney Local Health District at Westmead stopped any pound research use in or around 1997-98 before the Companion Animals Act 1998 No 87 was introduced. No other active work has been done on pounds dogs since this time.

However, a rare breeding colony of dogs with fucosidosis as a model for this rare genetic disorder in children (characterized by deficiency of the enzyme alpha-L-fucosidase) was maintained until 22nd September 2008, while seeking homes for them after the last breeding of pups in January 2008.

I am not aware of any use of cats for research purposes within the jurisdiction over the same period.
