Briefing for the Commissioner

Timeline and related information regarding John Ian EDWARDS firearms application

- John Ian Edwards was subject of an Apprehended Violence order issued on 15 August 2000 and expired on 15 August 2003.
- Under section 11(5)(c) of the Firearms Act 1996 a firearms licence must not be issued to any
  person who is the subject of an AVO, or has been at any time within 10 years before the
  application for the licence was made.
- Note: The National Firearms Agreement sets exclusion periods after a person has been the subject of an AVO at 5 years. NSW is double that.
- On 26 September 2010 an application was received at the Firearms Registry from EDWARDS for a Category A/B license.
- On 27 September 2010 the application was refused as it was made within the 10 year exclusion period.
- On 15 August 2013 the 10 year exclusion period finished.
- A P650 form is a form which everyone who wishes to obtain any type of firearms license
  must complete in order to undertake the Firearms Safety Training Course, which is a
  mandatory pre-requisite to obtaining a firearms license.
- The P650 form contains several assurances. As well as answering the questions set out by the Firearms Regulations, an applicant provides an acknowledgement that it is a serious offence to provide false or misleading information. A Certified instructor or Club / Range Official of an accredited Club must then make a decision whether to authorise the applicant to shoot, and sign the P650 accordingly.
- If an applicant answers yes to any of the questions on a P650 then the applicant cannot
  participate in any activities on the range, including a Firearms Safety Training Course or a
  trial shoot. If an applicant seeks a review the form is referred to the Firearms Registry
- if the Firearms Registry receives a referred P650 then it sends a letter to the applicant advising them of the mechanism to apply for a section 28 Permit.
- Date not known (must be after 10 December 2016) a P650 form was received at the Firearms Registry for EDWARDS certified by properties of the Hornsby RSL Rifle Club (club approval number: 384). The date of signature on the form is listed as 10 December 2016. On that form EDWARDS marked "YES" indicating he had previously been refused a firearms licence application.
- On 9 January 2017 a P650 form was received at the Firearms Registry for Mr Edwards certified by Communication of the Ku-Ring-Gai Pistol Club (club approval number: 403922643).

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### Sensitive

On that form EDWARDS marked "YES" indicating he had previously been refused a firearms licence application.

- On 24 January 2017 two letters sent to Mr Edwards advising him to apply for a section 28
  Permit in order to complete the mandatory training for a firearms licence. One letter was for
  the Category A/B requirement (rifle) and one letter was for the Category H requirement
  (pistol)
- On the 8 February 2017 an application for a permit to participate in the Firearms Safety Training course for a pistol and a separate form for a rifle was received from EDWARDS.
- The applications were reviewed by the probity team at the Firearms Registry who conducted
  the Criminal Names Index, National Names Index, Intelligence holdings and a thorough
  review of the COPS profile to identify if there was any legislative impediment to EDWARDS
  obtaining either licence.
- On the 18 March 2017 section 28 Permits were issued to enable EDWARDS to participate in the Firearms Safety Training course- one for Category A/B (permit number: 4117433520) and one for Category H (permit number: 411743597).

NOTE: The section 28 permits only permitted EDWARDS to participate in the Firearms Safety Training Course. It does not permit anything else.

- On the 28 April 2017 an email received from Mr Edwards requesting that his Category n/8 s
  Permit (number: 4117433520) be amended to allow him to undertake the course at St
  Mary's Pistol Club rather than Ku-Ring-Gai. Mr Edwards claims that he did not "get along
  very well with the President" of Ku-Ring-Gai and preferred not to be associated with that
  Club.
- On the 2 May 2017 the NSW Firearms Registry emailed Mr Edwards to confirm that the amendment had been made and issued an update section 28 Permit.
- On the 11 May 2017 Mr EDWARDS lodged an application for a firearms licence (Category A/B) with the Firearms Registry. The application was accompanied by a completed Genuine Reason Form -- Recreational Hunting / Vermin Control, a Statement of Attainment certification from the Firearms Safety and Training Council Limited indicating he had successfully completed the Firearms Safety Course, and a letter of membership from the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia.
- NOTE: Attached to this briefing is a copy of the application, which includes the letter from
  the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia identifying that membership of an approved
  shooting organisation is a genuine reason for holding a firearms licence. Under the
  legislation this is one of the identified genuine reasons which also include Ownership or
  Occupancy of Rural Land, Permission to Shoot from the owner or occupier of rural land
  and Permission to Shoot from a Prescribed Government Agency.

### Sensitive

- On the 22 May 2017 EDWARDS lodged an application for Probationary Pistol licence. The
  application was accompanied by a completed Genuine Reason Form Sport / Target
  Shooting, a Statement of Attainment certification from the Firearms Safety and Training
  Council Limited indicating he had successfully completed the Firearms Safety Course, and a
  letter of membership from the Sporting Shooters Association of Australia.
- The applications were reviewed by the probity team at the Firearms Registry who conducted the Criminal Names Index, National Names Index, Intelligence holdings and a thorough review of the COPS profile to identify if there was any legislative impediment to EDWARDS obtaining either licence.
- On the 30 June 2017 a firearms licence (Category A/B) was approved and issued to EDWARDS.
- On the 10 July 2017 a probationary pistol licence was approved and issued to EDWARDS.
- NOTE: Under the 2003 National Handgun Agreement an applicant for a pistol licence is on probation for 6 months. During that time they must complete mandatory training requirements, cannot purchase a handgun and can only handle a handgun under supervision.
- On the 2 February 2018 EDWARDS lodged a permit to acquire for an H9 Centrefire Handgun lodged. Every permit to acquire requires the applicant to nominate where the firearm will be stored. FDWARDS nominated his locker at the St Marys Gun Club.
- On the 4 March 2018 the permit to acquire was granted.
- On the 13 March 2018 EDWARDS purchased from Horsley Park Gun Shop a Smith & Wesson 586, .357 calibre handgun.
- On the 29 March 2018 EDWARDS lodged a permit to acquire for an additional H9 Centrefire Handgun, again indicating the handgun was to be stored at the St Marys Gun Club.
- On the 12 April 2018 the permit to acquire was granted.
- 17 April 2018 EDWARDS purchased from Horsley Park Gun Shop a Glock 17A Gen. 4, 9mm Luger handgun.
- On the 9 June 2018 an application for a full Category H licence sent to registered address

<sup>\*\*</sup> In September 2017 FDWARDS was granted permits to acquire 2 x rifle. In December 2017 he was granted a permit to acquire 1 x rifle. All 3 were purchased. He indicated that he would be storing them at the St Marys Gun Club.
