



NSW Upper House Modern Slavery Committee - Review of the Modern Slavery Act 2018

Further Recommendations for Committee's Consideration:

- 1) To establish a friends of Abolishing Slavery in NSW Parliament.**
- 2) Focus on actions that will break the back of the socioeconomic benefits of using slavery.**
- 3) That no business should be able to supply to the NSW Govt if there supply line is not slave proofed.**
- 4) That the Hotline remains in the hands of NGO's supported by the Commissioner's office.**
- 5) That the restoration of penalties that could implicate Directors who deliberately mislead Commissioner in their Modern Slavery Statements. As the original bill had in it.**
- 6) That most of the amendments from the Govt in 2021 be rescinded and the Original 2018 Act be fully reinstated.**
- 7) The Commissioner have the power to name and shame noncomplying Companies.**
- 8) That the Commissioner Dept be resourced correctly to play a part in prosecuting those guilty of using slavery in their supply lines or using slavery like practises in their supply lines.**
- 9) That the NSW Government endorse The SlaveCheck Foundation's Pilot and be given total support to help change the face of reporting of compliance in NSW, Australia and Globally.**
 - a) That the pilot being a (game changer – Kevin Hyland) be implemented through the NSW of Ministry of Manufacturing and Procurement.**
 - b) After the implementation of the Pilot that the ongoing results are reported to the Modern Slavery Committee.**
- 10) That harmonisation with Federal Legislation will only be if it is strengthening the NSW position dealing with Modern Day Slavery.**
- 11) That NSW Government write to other states and encourage them to establishing their own Modern Slavery Act and Commissioner.**
- 12) That the Commissioner be resourced appropriately to educate and train target areas of Modern-Day Slavery with the goal of lifting business compliance.**
