There are no corrections requested to the transcript. Regarding the question taken on notice, AISNSW provides the following response;

Independent schools operate autonomously and set their own expectations for school staff about professional learning. Staff in Independent schools may be provided with formal study opportunities and engage in professional learning focused on strengthening their understanding and building capacity in evidence-based, best practice to support students with disability. AISNSW holds no data about professional development incentives offered by individual schools, but anecdotally we are aware that many Independent schools choose to support their staff undertake further study in a range of areas, including special education. Some schools offer financial support for study, other schools provide release time (study time), or other recognition. This support is not limited to classroom teachers undertaking postgraduate qualifications in special education. Some special schools actively encourage teachers aides to undertake undergraduate teaching qualifications in special education, making special ed teaching a natural career progression option that values the experience of those working with students with disability.
