
- Chair Electoral Commissioner

Governing Legislation





Funding .. Three Funds

- Central Fund ~ for the Legislative Council election
- Constituency Fund ~ for the Legislative Assembly election
- Political Education Fund ~ for postage and materials for the education of the electorate in party policies
- Constituency & Central Fund calculation
 - Calculated after Writ issued (SGE March 5, 2007)
 - CPI Indexed unit



SGE 2007 \$2.69 per elector

Disclosure Obligations


- Declarations received by the EFA
 - Political Donations
 - Political Expenditure
 - Claims for public funding
- Disclosure Period
 - Generally 4 years, but several variations
 - Commences 31st day after the previous election
 - Finishes 30 days after the current election
 - To be submitted within 120 days of return of writs for GE and 120 days of election for LGE
- Political Donors to disclose
 - Making of a donation to party, group or candidate
 - Providing a service at discounted or no charge
 - Giving of a gift
 - Purchasing of tickets or other item relating to a fundraising event

3 key suggestions

- 1. Annual Declarations
- 2. Electronic Filing
- 3. Political Donor Identification system



Recommendation 1: Annual Declarations

Current Issues

- Confusion over what constitutes the reporting period
- Record keeping for 4-years is onerous
- Value of information diminishes due to age
- Transactional processing peak for EFA 180,000 records

Benefits of recommendation

- Improved transparency
- Increased opportunity for public scrutiny
- Simplify compliance, easier to understand
- Ease the reporting burden
- Smooth the processing peak
- Consistent with other reporting regimes e.g. ATO, ASIC, AEC



Recommendation 2: Electronic Filing

Current Issues

- Manual paper based reporting system
- Double handled: (1) Party/Candidate/Donor and (2) EFA staff
- Data validation issues
- Onerous to process

Benefits of Recommendation

- On-line using common web technologies
- Improved efficiency one entry only, direct to EFA system
- Allows frequent YTD snap-shots of data via the web
- Provision of 'searchable' fields name, postcode. etc
- Assists with a donor identification system (Recommendation 3)



Recommendation 3: Political Donor Identification

Current Issues

- Difficulty in matching records between declarations made by:
 - Party, group or Candidates and
 - declarations made by the donors

Benefits of Recommendation

- Simple solution of Elector Roll identification or ABN
 - Persons
 - Donor must be on the electoral roll and supply sufficient information to be identified from the roll
 - Organisations
 - Donor advises their ABN
