FURTHER QUESTIONS

COMMISSIONER FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

1. Do you believe that children (persons less than 18 years of age), living in a same-sex parental arrangement, should have a legal right to be informed about their biological heritage?

The same arrangements that are in place for all adopted children should apply to same sex parental arrangements.

Being truthful and honest with children about their adoption arrangements and their background is important for their development and wellbeing. Best practice in adoption is that all adopted children have the legal right to know about their origins, including biological heritage.

2. Do you believe that children (persons less than 18 years of age), living in a same-sex parental arrangement, should have a legal right to spend time with the biological parent who does not reside with the same-sex couple?

The same arrangements that are in place for all adopted children should apply to same sex parental arrangements.

Any contact arrangements with biological parents should be determined on a case-by-case basis, holding the child's best interests paramount, in line with best practice in adoption (Refer to the Department of Community Services' Research to Practice Notes: Permanency Planning and Placement Stability). The child's wishes must be taken into account in determining contact.

3. Given the variety of parenting arrangements that exist, why not amend the *Adoption Act* to provide for the adoption of children by one, two or more than two adults, subject to meeting the "paramountcy principle"?

Many existing parenting arrangements today are diverse and complex. Blended families from the re-marriage of one or both biological parents are relatively common. Children also live in other arrangements where parenting is shared by more than two adults or across a specific community.

Given that such arrangements exist, we need to further examine the effect of these on a child's legal rights and parental obligations before being able to comment on whether the Act should provide for the adoption of children by one, two or more than two adults.
