QUESTION 10 – PAYING BILLS ON TIME

QUESTION

a. Since April, on how many occasions has the agency not paid a supplier or contractor for more than 30 days?

b. How many bills have been outstanding for longer than that period?

ANSWER

a and b. In accordance with its election commitment the NSW Liberals & Nationals Government has instituted a policy of paying bills ontime. This policy came into effect on 11 July 2011. Payments for outstanding accounts are to be made by Government agencies within 30 calendar days or they will face paying penalty interest on the outstanding debt. State Owned Corporations will be encouraged to adopt the payment regime. Agencies have been directed to report their payment performance to the Department of Finance and Services who will post the Government's payment performance report every quarter on their website. The Auditor-General will conduct a compliance review in 2013 to ensure the on-time payment policy is adhered to.

ANSWER

a – b. NSW Government agencies provide grants to local government councils and a range of non government, non-profit organisations for the purpose of providing a service to the community or undertaking a project of benefit to the community. Grants administration in NSW occurs within the legal and regulatory framework in which the NSW Government operates.

All Government Departments and authorities are required to publish details of grants made to non government organisations in their annual report. The requirements are set out in Premier's Memorandum 91-34.

The policy has not changed since Labor was in Government.

a. The NSW Government is developing Industry Action Plans to position key sectors of the State's economy for strong growth, resilience, improved innovation and productivity, global competitiveness, and new investment opportunities over the next decade. In order to capture the perspectives of regional digital industry stakeholders, the Government will be undertaking a range of community engagement activities, including through metropolitan and regional forums, online consultation and a request for submissions to inform the development of the Digital Economy Industry Action Plan. The Government will also be providing information to relevant industry associations for dissemination to their memberships and networks across the State.

b. Once finalised the Digital Economy Industry Action Plan will be resourced through existing agency resources and/or relevant supplementation at the appropriate time

a. The recruitment process commenced in March 2011.

b - c. Approval from Department of Premier and Cabinet (DPC) was necessary prior to appointing a recruitment agency which was sought and secured. The recruitment was done in accordance with DPC guidelines and protocols.

d. The term is for 2 years with an option of a 12 month extension.

e. Yes, performance reviews are conducted after a 6 month probation period and then annually.

f. The review is conducted by the Executive of NSW Trade & Investment.

QUESTION

a. The Document NSW 2021, A Plan to make NSW Number One says you are responsible for and I quote; "Increase tourism in NSW with double the visitor expenditure by 2020", How do you plan on achieving this by 2020?

b. The document NSW 2021, A Plan to make NSW Number One it says you are responsible for and I quote;" Increase the value of primary industries and mining production by 30% by2020", How do you plan on achieving this by 2020?

ANSWER

a - b. Under the NSW 2021 plan, the Minister for Trade & Investment, Regional Infrastructure and Services is the lead Minister for goals 1,3 & 4:

- 1. Improve the performance of the NSW Economy
- 3. Drive Economic growth in regional NSW
- 4. Increase the competitiveness of doing business in NSW

The Department of Trade and Investment, Regional Infrastructure and Services is currently implementing a range of measures to ensure we achieve the targets under those three goals.

On tourism, the NSW Government has established the Visitor Economy Taskforce (VET) to develop a tourism and events strategy to double overnight expenditure by 2020 and deliver a report to Government May 2012. The Taskforce members are industry leaders with experience in tourism and business in general, The Chairman is Russell Balding AO and its members are John King, OAM, the Hon. Bruce Baird and Sandra Chipchase, CEO of Destination NSW. Information on the Taskforce, including its Terms of Reference, is publicly available at www.haveyoursay.nsw.gov.au/.

The NSW Government will support the primary industries and resources sectors through the delivery of a broad range of programmes which will assist the sectors improve their productivity and efficiency and increase their value.

ANSWER

a. NSW Trade & Investment has 16 regional offices located outside the Sydney Metropolitan area. The Department also has an office in Western Sydney in Parramatta, in addition to its main office in Sydney CBD.

b. Offices are located at Nowra, Wollongong, Goulburn, Newcastle, Ourimbah, Orange, Dubbo, Broken Hill, Albury, Wagga Wagga, Port Macquarie, Coffs Harbour, Armidale, Tamworth, Lismore and Tweed Heads.

c. Staff figures for the agency are reported in the Department's Annual Report.

d. The Government has no plans to close NSW Trade & Investment regional offices.

ANSWER

a - c. By establishing Infrastructure NSW, the NSW Liberals & Nationals Government honoured an election commitment to restore integrity and accountability into infrastructure forward planning and delivery. Part of that election commitment also included quarantining at least 30% of the Restart NSW funding for projects outside Sydney, Newcastle and Wollongong. All projects funded by Restart NSW will be considered as part of a detailed five year infrastructure plan and 20 year State Infrastructure Strategy, with Infrastructure NSW to make recommendations as to which projects will be funded.

QUESTION 20 – IN RELATION TO RESTART NSW

QUESTION

a. You've promised to create \$160m resources for the regions program for mining affected areas, how much funding will be available from Restart NSW in each of the next four financial years for this program?

b. How will you determine which communities are eligible for the funding?

c. What mechanisms have you put in place to ensure that projects receiving funding under this program would not have received funding under other programs – in other words how are you guaranteeing this is not replacement funding?

d. The Government suggested that its Restart NSW fund would have nearly \$5 billion, being \$1.5 billion from the arrangement with the desal plant and \$3.5 billion from 'windfall gains'. What is Treasury's prediction for how much will be in the fund for each of the next three years?

e. What arrangements does the Government have in place to ensure that Restart NSW funds are not replacing other Government capital funds?

ANSWER

a-e) In recognition of the need to return a fair share to the regions the NSW Government is committed to delivering our 'Regional Kickstart' program. Under this program the Government will allocate 30% of our new capital fund – 'Restart NSW' - into regional NSW in our first term. A portion of this – up to \$160M over four years - will be directed to 'Resources for the Regions' to deliver infrastructure for mining-affected communities.

The first step – the assessment of the economic impact on mining-affected regions and on the contribution they make to the State in economic activity and production of revenue – is in progress. This process has involved the Department of Trade and Investment; Office of Resources and Energy; Department of Premier and Cabinet; Department of Planning and Infrastructure; NSW Treasury; Department of Finance and Services; and Transport for NSW.

Restart NSW is being funded from appropriations by Parliament and the budget process, including any such money certified as 'windfall tax revenue'; realisation of the capital invested in assets, such as from the Sydney Desalination Plant and Port Botany; and potentially borrowings, including the issue of special bonds to the people of New South Wales such as Waratah bonds.

The economic assessment of mining affected communities is progressing on schedule, after which the Government will move to begin addressing some of the impacts of the current mining boom on communities in the Hunter, Upper Hunter and elsewhere.

- a. The actual expenditure, inclusive of operating costs and salaries for each trade post for 2010-2011 was as follows:
- India, Mumbai Office: \$426,270.00
- Abu Dhabi: \$477,775.00
- Guangzhou: \$299,472.00
- Shanghai Office: \$458,940.00

b. The performance measures for each trade post are a return of 20 to 1 in investment or export outcomes on expenditure.
