- 136. How do the Budget Papers account for compliance by the DEC in delivering the government's "efficiency dividends" and "labour expense cap"?
- 137. Taking into account inflations, what are the real increases/decreases in recurrent and capital expenditure funding over what was allocated in last year's budget and over last year's revised budget?
- 138. Can the Minister outline the enhanced system for auditing and oversight of school Principal decision making to ensure an appropriate use of State funds after the implementation of Local Schools Local Decisions?
- 139. Can the Minister identify the intervention point for a school that is failing to adhere to their budgeting constraints?
- 140. Why were the budget allocations for both primary and secondary public schools underspent last year while the budget allocation for non-government schools was exceeded by \$16 million?
 - a. How was this additional \$16 million spent?
- 141. How much has the DEC underspent its public primary and secondary school budget over the last financial year?
 - a. Where did these savings come from?
- 142. Given the Budget Estimates (3-8) forecasts that:
 - a. Government primary education will have 135 FTE fewer employees next financial year despite a forecast enrolment increase of 7,359 students, a 1.7 per cent enrolment increase,
 - b. Government funding of primary education will increase by 3.4 per cent on the revised budget but will be only 1 per cent more than last year's budget allocation,
 - c. Government secondary education will have 315 fewer employees despite a forecast enrolment increase of 941 students representing a 0.3 per cent increase,
 - d. Government funding of secondary schools will increase by 1.8 per cent on the revised budget but will suffer a 0.4 per cent cut on last year's budget allocation,
 - e. Why is funding not keeping pace with enrolment increase?
- 143. Given current overcrowding, enrolment increases and ageing school building and technology infrastructure, how is the DEC planning to respond to the underinvestment in capital works identified by the Review of Funding into Schooling (Gonski Review)?
- 144. Budget Estimates (3-5) states that \$320 million will be spent on school maintenance in the current financial year, "a 23 per cent increase over three years", what is the increase on what was allocated in last year's budget and the revised budget?
- 145. The two preceding Budgets have called for \$1.7 billion in savings from the public education budget over the term of the government. In his 2013 Budget Speech, Treasurer Mike Baird states in regard to the funding of the National Education Reform Agreement that the Government had "made tough decisions in order to release an additional \$1.76 billion over the next 6 years". Are the earlier announced savings offsetting the costs of the National Education Reform Agreement?

- 146. Given the O'Farrell government's pursuit of 1.2% labour expense cap coupled with the impact of the Local Schools Local Decisions push, will the Minister ensure that the current direct support provided to their children and their teachers by School Administrative and Support staff will be quarantined from the labour expense cap?
- 147. The current training and support provided by the Department to School Administrative and Support Staff is provided on a Departmental regional basis. The Department has condensed these regions and reduced the head office support to this valuable program. Will the department continue to commit to providing the funding and support to the School Administrative and Support Staff program at the current levels of both funding and organisational support given the value this program has to the professionalism of School Administrative and Support Staff within the current context of significant change?
- 148. In his budget speech, Treasurer Mike Baird stated that an additional 500 school teachers had been hired,
 - a. Under what arrangements have these teachers been employed?
 - b. Where have these teachers been deployed?
- 149. Why does a primary school of 500 students receive no executive release while a high school of the same size receives eleven days of executive release per week?
- 150. What funding has been set aside in the budget to allow Primary School Executives to have the same opportunity as their secondary colleagues to provide quality educational leadership?
- 151. Local Schools Local Decisions depends heavily on principals making strategic decisions using the new Learning Management Business Reform solution (LMBR). What funding has been allocated to ensure there sufficient support in the field for the initial 229 schools as the program finally gets closer?
 - a. Is there sufficient funding and staff to provide support for the 2000 remaining schools as they undergo preparation and implementation of this program in 2014?
- 152. Can the State Government confirm the site for the proposed additional school on the North Shore?
- 153. Given the large number of Public Schools within growing population areas, who are experiencing overcrowding and larger than sustainable enrolment numbers, (as witnessed in the North Shore of Sydney) what long term commitment has the government placed on ensuring the quality of learning environments for our children?
- 154. Given the data from the Auditor General regarding the raised school leaving age and the significant gaps in student engagement the data highlights, what will the Government do to ensure better outcomes for students?
- 155. Has there been a review to identify if the legislative changes have been successful in engagement or if it is merely holding children in schools longer?
- 156. What opportunities are going to be made for government schools to reduce the ever increasing utility expenses for operating? Are there grants, concessions or any such programs in the works?

- 159. The New South Wales Government and Minister Piccoli have made a strong commitment to consult with educational stakeholder groups to address the issues and concerns surrounding education in rural and remote areas of New South Wales.
 - a. Is this consultation currently under way?
 - b. Given that many of the issues surrounding rural and remote education are significant and far-reaching, what funding has been allocated within the budget to address the needs and current short-comings of educational provision for rural and remote school students as identified in this consultation process?
- 160. Is there any opportunity to persuade the Federal Government that P&C Associations, currently recognised charitable status holders, become eligible for tax deductable status for donations in line with the eligibility of non- government and ethics groups?
