INQUIRY INTO SOCIAL, PUBLIC AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING

A parliamentary committee is coming to Tamworth and Dubbo to hear the local community's views on social, public and affordable housing.

Committee Chair, the Hon Paul Green MLC said, "The Committee is interested in the supply and demand of social, public and affordable housing in regional areas, and would like to gain a better understanding of the link between the lack of appropriate housing of this type and indicators of social disadvantage."

"The lack of shelter and housing can lead to a number of adverse social and economic outcomes for people." Mr Green continued, "That is why we will be considering options that increase the supply of this type of housing. At the same time we will be examining how to improve social service integration to support tenants' livelihoods and wellbeing."

Mr Green emphasised the committee's keen interest in engaging with relevant stakeholders. "We are holding regional hearings in Tamworth and Dubbo and a public forum in Dubbo. Everyone is welcome to attend the public hearings or to register to address the Committee at the public forum," Mr Green added.
