1. During your hearing Dr Coleborne said that she understood that the dates for submitting applications to placement panels is common across all regions. Can you please check and confirm if this is so?

RESPONSE:

Placement panels in all regions meet at least once each term to consider students' applications for support within the provisions available to them.

The dates for submitting applications to placement panels varies across the state due mainly to differences in demographic and geographic factors.

In smaller regions one placement panel may be all that is required to consider all applications while in larger regions these panels can be based on disability type or location and be more or less frequent depending on demand.
