IMPACTS OF COAL SEAM GAS - TAREE HEARING

Committee seeks to balance environmental, social and economic objectives of mining activity

A Parliamentary Committee will visit Taree to investigate the environmental, economic and social impacts of coal seam gas mining in NSW, following widespread concerns from landholders, farmers and environmentalists worried about the effects of this rapidly growing industry.

"The Committee has received close to 1,000 written submissions from all over NSW. We have heard from many residents in Taree and surrounding areas, in particular landholders at Gloucester, who are potentially affected by plans for coal seam gas development", explains the Chair of the Committee, the Hon, Robert Brown MLC.

"Given the level of public interest in the area, I am pleased to announce that the Committee will hold a public hearing at Taree, so that local residents can have their say on this important issue."
