Questions on Notice: Inquiry into the Education Amendment (Ethics Classes Repeal) Bill 2011 Rev Dr Michael Jensen

Questions from the Hon Sarah Mitchell:

1. In your appearance before the committee, you raised the question as to whether or not other classes might be able to compete with SRE and SEE in the allocated teaching slot. Other witness and submissions have indicated they would like to see a comparative religion course offered. Would you like to see a comparative religion course, or other similar courses offered, or do you feel the current SRE and SEE classes are sufficient?
