Questions from Dr John Kaye MLC

QUESTION 1

- a) Why is the NSW Govt forcing electricity retailers to include misleading information on its post-1 July bills in the form of the new 'red text'?
- b) Why has the Minister not included the infrastructure component of bill increases?

ANSWER

(a) - (b)

The carbon tax and other green schemes figure required to be printed on the front page of customer bills has been independently determined by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) as part of its annual review of electricity prices.

Information on bill composition is publically available on IPART's website.

What is the Minister doing to address climate change and the local health and economic impacts of coal mining and the use of coal to generate electricity in NSW?

ANSWER

The economic benefits of the NSW coal industry are significant.

Coal is NSW's single largest export in value terms. In 2011-12, NSW coal exports were 136.4 million tonnes worth an estimated \$16.8 billion, representing an increase of over 12 per cent on the previous year's 121.7 million tonnes.

Coal generates substantial royalties which are used to fund infrastructure and services for the benefit of all citizens of the State. In 2011-12 coal royalties were more than \$1.3 billion.

Mining brings significant economic benefits and employment opportunities to people living in regional and rural areas of the State. Direct employment in the NSW coal industry as at December 2011 was 23,588, an increase of some 24 per cent on December 2010. Many of these jobs are highly-skilled and well-paid positions.

What is the Minister doing to phase out coal mining and the use of coal to generate electricity?

ANSWER

According to 2012-13 Budget figures, the most recent estimate of the total cost of the Solar Bonus Scheme is approximately \$1.314 billion.

IPART's Solar feed-in tariffs: Setting a fair and reasonable value for electricity generated by small-scale solar PV units in NSW determined that the installation of solar systems has had relatively little impact on peak demand across the network.

Please provide the electricity network dividends and income tax equivalent payments to the NSW government for each of the past five financial years?

ANSWER

- (a) Has any agency of the NSW government undertaken any research into the level of subsidy required to ensure that electricity generated by native forest wood biomass would be economic? Please provide details.
- (b) If not, what steps have you as Energy Minister taken to have such research undertaken?

ANSWER

No recent direct study has taken place due to the existing regulatory regime at both State and Federal levels that constrain the use of wood residues from native forests.

- (a) Has any agency of the NSW government undertaken any research into the quantity of greenhouse gases emitted per unit of electricity generated from native forest wood biomass (including GHG emissions from the logging itself)? Please provide details.
- (b) If not, what steps have you as Energy Minister taken to have such research undertaken?

ANSWER

- a) What is the current status of the NSW government's review into TransGrid's proposed Stroud to Lansdowne transmission line?
- b) If the review has been completed, what were the review's findings?

 - i) The Lismore to Dumaresq transmission line is not required until at least 2016 and maybe not until the 2020s?
 - ii) The Stroud to Taree transmission line is not required until the early 2020s?
 - iii) If so, what steps has the Minister taken to have these two projects taken off the table and to work with the local communities affected to drive investment in strategic demand management and local renewable energy supply alternatives?

ANSWER

The NSW Government announced an independent review into the future electricity and energy needs for the Mid North Coast on 2 November 2012.

A draft report will be made available for community submissions prior to being finalised in February next year.
