

The Gambling Impact Society (GIS)

The Gambling Impact Society (NSW) Inc. was formed in July 2000 by a group of people who had been directly affected by problem gambling. We are a registered Health Promotion Charity run on a not-for-profit basis by volunteers and professionals working in the field of problem gambling and social welfare. Our primary role is to raise awareness about the multi-layered impacts of problem gambling in the community.

What is Problem Gambling?

"Problem Gambling is characterised by difficulties in limiting money and/or time spent gambling which leads to adverse consequences for the gambler, others or for the community" (Problem Gambling and Harm: Towards a National Definition, Nov. 2005). Some consider this behaviour similar to an addiction, others a learnt behaviour which can be unlearnt.

We know that with appropriate treatment and support, along with family and community understanding many people are able to turn their lives around. Thereby freeing themselves from the roller coaster of emotional, relationship and financial crises of problem gambling.
