

## IMPACTS OF COAL SEAM GAS - NORTH COAST HEARING

Committee seeking to balance environmental, social and economic objectives of mining activity

A Parliamentary Committee will visit the North Coast to investigate the environmental, economic and social impacts of coal seam gas mining in NSW, following widespread concerns from landholders, farmers and environmentalists worried about the effects of this rapidly growing industry.
"The Committee has received hundreds of written submissions from all over NSW. We have heard from a number of North Coast residents, in particular landholders from around Casino and Kyogle, who are potentially affected by plans for coal seam gas development", explains the Chair of the Committee, the Hon. Robert Brown MLC.
"Given the level of public interest from the area, I am pleased to announce that the Committee will hold a public hearing at Alstonville, so that North Coast residents can have their say on this important issue."

The Committee is holding three more public hearings in regional areas: Taree, Narrabri and Bowral. Two public hearings will be held at Parliament House in Sydney.
