EXAMINATION OF PROPOSED EXPENDITURE FOR THE PORTFOLIO AREAS OF LANDS, RURAL AFFAIRS AND REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT -RAISED BY THE HON TREVOR KHAN MLC

Regional Development Portfolio

QUESTION 1: Population growth in NSW

ANSWER:

I am advised that Australian Bureau of Statistics figures for population growth in NSW are as follows:

- from 2005 to 2006 the yearly growth for regional NSW was 0.84%
- from 2005 to 2006 the yearly growth for Sydney was 0.89%
- from 2001 to 2006 the average annual growth rate for regional NSW was 0.7%
- from 2001 to 2006 the average annual growth rate for Sydney was 0.8%

QUESTION 2: Back O' Bourke Exhibition Centre

ANSWER:

The Department of State and Regional Development has offered of \$215,000 to Back O' Bourke Centre Limited toward the establishment of the Back O' Bourke Exhibition Centre and business planning to support a case for Federal Government funding for the centre.

QUESTION 3: Barwon Darling Alliance area

ANSWER:

Since mid 2004 the Department of State and Regional Development has offered assistance for a range of projects in the Barwon Darling Alliance area.

Under its Business Investment Programs the Department has facilitated seven projects representing over \$21 million in capital investment and the creation or retention of 166 jobs. Projects facilitated include establishment of a 10,000 head feedlot with a stockfeed processing plant in Coonamble and expansion of a road freight business in Bourke. Under its New Market Expansion Program, the Department has offered assistance to three firms - Barriekneal Housing & Community Ltd, Murdi Paaki Regional Enterprise Corporation Ltd (Wilcannia Brickworks), Pulkurru Building Co Ltd - to pursue new markets for their products.

Under its Community Economic Development Programs the Department has provided financial assistance totalling \$282,840 for a range of projects.
