Parents and teachers are entitled to know the content of any proposed course to be introduced into NSW schools. This is particularly necessary in any 'ethics' course since our ethics influence our behaviour.

What about terrorists? Don't they too have a code of 'ethics'.

These examples are extreme, but they show how dangerous ideas can be when there are no boundaries, no objective right and wrong. Australia was built on Christian ethics. If there are to be new 'ethics' in this country, we need to know what they are, so parents, teachers, legislators etc, can make informed decisions.

Children who are withdrawn from the current scripture classes in our schools, certainly need constructive activities. To simply lump them all in vague 'ethics' classes is not the answer.

As a parent, grandparent and former primary school teacher, I wish to strongly urge the repeal of the ALP-Green Ethics Course Bill.
