We have already met with closed gates on local TSR's in our area which has happened with no notice to the public, I find this very alarming. As members of the Upper Murray Horse Mans association for over ten years we have been involved in regular meetings and outings with fellow horse men in the high country of NSW where we have used public land reserves as a venue for our riding, however recently we have been closed out of certain areas which we have received little or no notification of.
