There are so many things wrong with the industry it is difficult to know where to start and when to stop. Something must be done about the overbreeding and consequent 'wastage' of healthy animals who just aren't wanted anymore because they can't race or can't win money. Regulation would be something, but has to be enforced and people find ways round it - so maybe some kind of incentive - to stop overbreeding and to stop killing dogs. The industry could subsidise places that find homes for the animals and reward owners who do the right thing by the animals (while fining or banning owners who can't account for how their dogs ended up.)
