I wish to make a submission of comment regarding outcomes of home schooling including in relation to transition to further study and work.

My sisters and I were homeschooled in NSW between the years 1995 and 2007. My older sister went to the University of Newscastle and graduated as a doctor of medicine. She is now a qualified GP. I went on to do a Bachelor of Arts by correspondence, followed by a Diploma of Education at the Australian Catholic University in Canberra.
