Cognitive constructivism is influenced by Piaget as a theory of learning, where learners do not learn from receiving information but instead constructing their own knowledge (Eggen & Kauchak, 2010).

Social constructivism is similar in constructing knowledge, but it is greatly influenced by Vygotsky theories in that learners learn through social interaction. They learn socially and internalise it later. J. Martin (as cited in Eggen & Kauchak, 2010 p.227) states that social constructivism is "the view most influential in guiding the thinking of educational leaders and teachers".
