as a matter of urgency the Legislative Council must investigate the unexplained alterations to the

LEP covering Newcastle's King Edward park.

The LEP zoned the land on which the bowling club once stood as public open space that specifically

excluded a function centre.

A developer, I believe one of Keith Stronach's companies, made application to have the said site

exempted from the prohibition of a function centre. This was refused by Council.

That was the situation in February 2012, yet By June 2012 it was discovered that an exception had

been made allowing a function centre to be built on the site. Interestingly, the wording of the

amendment was exactly that of the developer in the DA.

Here it becomes interesting. There appears to be no record of the application going back to Council,

there was no public notification of the intention to change the LEP, there is no record of process for

the change nor reasons for it.

Given recent ICAC revelations regarding the influence that developers in Newcastle have had on

local and state politics, the lack of probity, the lack of transparency, the lack of public consultation

and the possible conflict of interests in this matter it is essential that the Upper House investigate

this matter.
