## INQUIRY INTO THE PERFORMANCE OF THE NSW ENVIRONMENT PROTECTION AUTHORITY

It seems clear to many that the EPAis failing inits duty to monitor and police air qualityin the micro environments surrounding domestic solid fuel burning heaters.

The high concentrations of particulate PM2.5 pollutants that surround most wood burning heaters, particularly in urban areas, (including those allegedly AS4013 compliant ones) are effectively ignored by the EPA who passes the problem off to local Councils to manage with inadequate, untrained human resources and a useless compliance tool in the form of the POEO Act that relies on visible "smoke"to identify pollutors when thwey know full well that the greatest health risk comes from the virtually invisible PM2.5s emitted by "modern" heaters.

The EPA needs to publicly acknowledge that all solid fuel heaters emit toxic pollutants, and to impliment policies nd strategies to plhase out and ultimately ban the use of solid fuel heaters in all built up urban areas, as it has done with back yard burning and as is favoured by the NSW Chief Health Officer.

A method to fund the monitorig and policing of point source pollution and to pay for a substantial buyback scheme the government could introduce a pollution tax based on firewood burnt This could be imposed on firewood sellers and impimented with the inclusion and co-operation of the FAA-- and a big stick.
