Marriage is ordained by God as an exclusive covenant between one man and one woman (Genesis 2:18). God designed marriage as the foundational element of all human society. A public exchange of vows, sexual intimacy and loving care constitute the essential elements of the marriage covenant. These three vital elements expressed by love and loyalty, faithfulness and responsibility constitute marriage, which Scripture declares is, in principle, permanent.

While having children is an important factor in marriage, sexual intimacy is designed for more than procreation. Sexual relationship assists in establishing, expressing and maintaining intimacy in the marriage.
