

INQUIRY INTO SAME SEX MARRIAGE LAW IN NSW

To the honourable members of my NSW Parliament

As a citizen Australia, born and bred in Sydney NSW, I do not and cannot endorse changes to the marriage law to allow "same-sex" marriage.

Marriage, was instituted for one man and one woman where, in principle, pro-creation is always possible. It is always this possibility that gives rise to the definition of marriage.

To call marriage, between two males or two females, where pro-creation, in principle, is impossible, means that marriage can be understood apart from pro-creation.
