To this day have never had a reply was the labour government worried about compensation. The losses to our fishery over the last 10 years is in the hundreds of thousands of dollars. This must stop and the rights to compensating must be looked at .All rights to these and many other national parks must be look at and our right to assess these parks be given back .WE own the right to fish these waters now parks say they are now Ramsar-wetlands and can no longer be fished. I have fish Moria State Forest over thirty years in 2002 it was listed to Ramsar. I went to meeting we were told the nothing would change g on fishing. This is now part of river red gum national park will this be the next park to be closed. See page 5 54 iv)we made this agreement. Parks Management have no right to stop us from fishing . I must thank Jason Rivett fellow fisher for the hard work over the last 12 month in finally gaining access to two parks.I went with Jaso 1 to Nocoleche and over five trips ten days the catch of yabbies was 3070kg worth just on forty thousand dollars .the best streeh of the paroo river on this park is still denied access to stating it is sensitive to enter that part of the Paroo this may have up to eighty thousand dollar worth of yabbies we must not be denied access to this and other parks.
