I really love the people and the greyhounds in the game and I treat everyone the same in racing and in business. I think that everyone should do the same thing.

My main concern at the moment is the drop off in participants. The owners and the punters are important and we need to keep them happy. The prize money is too low by interstate and other standards.

While owners do racing for the love of the sports there is a need for them to get a better return.

I have had about two hundred swabs taken over the years with not one positive and at \$200 a go I am a \$40,000 dollar man at the expense of prize money to everyone. I am glad I don't run my business along these lines.

The prices of travelling to racetracks keeps going up and because there are less trainers and dogs we have to race more for the same prize money.

Every time I ring the control board with a problem if they find the problem to hard I am left on the phone until it disengages. I would be a lot happier if they took my number and rang me back.
