The Student's Association represents the concerns of over 2000 students attending the Coffs Harbour Education Campus. Many of these students travel on the Pacific Highway daily to attend classes. Unfortunately, over the last few years, some of these students have been involved in serious accidents on the Pacific Highway. Parents of students have expressed their concerns, asking their children not to travel on the Pacific Highway, preferring to pay for airfares when they return home during holidays.

It is well recognised that the highway is inadequate for the volume of traffic and the solutions are well known.
