I am writing to voice my opposition to changing the definition of marriage.

The Little Macquarie Dictionary defines marriage as: "The legal union of a man and a woman".

This has been the foundation of the family and society for thousands of years.

It has worked successfully in producing, loving and training children in the family environment with a father and a mother.

Same sex couples are obviously incapable of producing children without the assistance of others, even if they wanted to have children. If they did have any children, these children would, at best, have one parent who had a 50% participation in their formation and another of the same sex who had no participation.

Marriage is deeply held by a large proportion of the population for cultural and religious reasons and this should be respected.

There is no law against people of the same sex living together or being friends, therefore there is no reason to legalise a situation which is not illegal.

I am happily married with 3 adult childred all of whom are married and have their own families.
