We are Northern Tablelands sheep and cattle graziers which have a three kilometre northern boundary of the Severn River, birthplace of the Darling River, and are not far upstream from the Pindari Dam Water Reserve. As result of this situation, we are constantly inundated with feral pigs, goats, and exotic wild deer from this reserve. Also to a much lesser extent wild dogs, thank heavens. Feral pigs are our biggest menace at the moment and we have to allocate a tremendous amount of time and resources to try and keep these pests under control. The reserve is just a haven for these pests and the river bank a highway which channels them onto the properties upstream.
