Parliamentary Inquiry into the State Government's Fit for the Future Local Government Reform Agenda

In my local government area of **Lane Cove** the State Government is proposing that our Council be merged with Hunter's Hill, Mosman, North Sydney, Willoughby and two-thirds of Ryde.

I agree with this approach of the State Government for Ryde for the following reasons -

- 1. The new Council will have a projected 2031 population of 365,400. In fact, I'd be in favour of even larger amalgamations.
- 2. Currently local Councils are too small and too parochial, resulting in individuals and small minorities to have too much impact at the cost of good governance and sensible decision making.
- 3. There is a need for integrated planning for major centres, Sydney Harbour foreshores, etc.
- 4. As a nation we are over-governed, over-regulated and over-administered resulting in total taxes, rates etc being too high, and in the too high a cost and too great a complexity when doing the most simple tasks whether as an individual or as a school, charity, sporting group, business or in any other capacity.

I believe that the Committee should consider my Council be amalgamated as per the State Government's recommendations, or preferably that much larger amalgamations be considered
