To the Committee examining the issue of same-sex marriage

I am speaking against changing existing laws. Trying to redefine something as universal and ancient as marriage (and so fundamental to the social health of our society) is essentially social engineering. Those that profess to be homosexual in our society number no more than 1.5% to 25 of the population, and though the relationships they enter into may be long lasting and mutually beneficial in many ways, these arrangements should not be called marriage.
