Greyhound Adoption Program

- 2.The acceptance time is to long[9 mths last time I enquired and that was a dog that was animal friendly]
- 3. No fostering [I approached an official to volunteer fostering and was never contacted]
- 4.To many restrictions on the dogs[not all people wanting to adopt need cat friendly dogs]
- 5.Not interested in promoting G.A[I invited GAP to a special meeting with some of their dogs, they never responded.] Kennel Inspections

Inspections at kennels are rare, and probably need more attention.

Dopina

In my opinion the doping of greyhounds must come under the welfare of banner. Penalties are not harsh enough and positive swabs are not dealt with quick enough

Frozen Semen Implants

FSI seems to be a bit of a concern to broodbitches, especially maiden bitches re, whelping and future services and seems to be a money issue more than a helpful one.

RECOMMODATIONS

Off course more money would be a big step forward for all problems, GRNSW do not involve participants as a part of vital decisions, which I feel would be an important asset to the industry.

GAP

- 1. More participant involvement and openness of the rehoming program.
- 2.Clubs to be more involved with GAP.
- 3. Fostering to be put in place.
- 4. Ease of restrictions for dogs to be rehomed.
- 5. More promotion at race meetings, social media and days out with public.

Kennel inspections

More thorough inspections required to ensure the industry is in good hands.

Doping

Severe penalties for performance enhancing drugs and more expedience with enquiries.

Positive swabs published on web site with cleared swabs

Penalties eg.1st Offence 3 Mths,2nd Offence 12mths,3rd Offence Life

Frozen Semen Implants

A investigation into the data on FSI re whelping problems and any other problems associated.

Other procedures not so invasive with no anathesia.
