RE: Submission to Inquiry into the performance of the NSW Environmental Protection Authority

Further to 1. (b) (v) of the Inquiry's terms of reference, I would like to make the following comments about the regulation of cruise passenger ships at the White Bay Cruise Terminal at Balmain and in particular the pollution controls that I feel are inadequate at many levels including:

- 1. The pollutants monitored (only sulphur dioxide and PM10 particles)
- 2. The limits set are higher than the UN recommends
- 3. There is no way to penalise an operator for a conditions breach
- 4. Low grade fuel is allowed
- 5. There is no grid electricity supply to the ships

In light of these concerns may I suggest that the committee recommends:

- 1. Ships should be required to use of 0.1 per cent sulphur fuel within 200 nautical miles of the port
- 2. Shore-to-ship power should be required for all ships using the port
- 3. Provision for fining operators that breach the above conditions and any other conditions (e.g. noise), should be made
- 4. The UN's recommended monitoring and limits should be applied for at least: sulphur oxides (SOX), nitrogen oxides (NOX), particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5), benzene, toluene, and formaldehyde

I note that my above items 1 & 2 were also recommended by DECCW (now EPA) and are common in other ports, for item 3 that monitoring has shown noise breaches have already occurred and yet no meaningful action can be taken, and for item 4 this suggestion is inline with the UN's World Health Organisation guidelines and a recent study by Sydney's Woolcock Institute of Medical Research.
