As the mother of 2 young children I am requesting that a FULL moratorium on ALL forms of coal seam gas (CSG) drilling be undertaken AS SOON AS POSSIBLE to assess environmental, social and health affects of this controversial proposal.

It is extraordinary that CSG is not subject to all environmental legislation including native vegetation and water management laws, as it stands now any community on or near a potential CSG source does not have legal rights to challenge or enforce environmental laws under which CSG companies operate this is absolutely outrageous, one rule for them another for us, totally unacceptable!

There SHOULD BE a provision of right in the Petroleum (Onshore) Act to allow landholders to REFUSE consent for CSG exploration or production on their land.
