The EPA's current creditability is in tatters. The public perception is that there are no meaningful development guidelines that will be effectively enforced by government. Abrogation of responsibility to enforce Koala protection in our forests, because the Forestry Dept "didn't see" the blindingly obvious evidence of Koalas, leads to complete disrespect for the law and for parliament. A 'spare change' fine of \$1500.00 for the radioactive pollution of an aquifers identifies that the govt is acting against the interests of Australians, and gives the rise to the impression that he government is purely acting for the interests of the money in a bag developers. The failure of the EPA to meaningfully manage compliance is resulting in increasingly broad spectrums of our communities turning to mass blockades and direct action.
