• l request that there be a full moratorium on all forms of coal seam gas drilling until the environmental, social and health impacts have been rigorously and independently assessed.

• CSG exploration and mining to be made subject to all relevant environmental legislation, including the native vegetation and water management laws.

 I suggest there should be provision of standing to ensure that the community has full legal rights to challenge and enforce environmental laws under which CSG companies are operating.

I suggest there should be a provision of a right in the Petroleum (Onshore) Act to allow landholders to refuse consent for CSG exploration or production on their land.

• I demand a prohibition on CSG exploration and mining in important bushland, valuable farmland, groundwater aquifers, all residential areas including rural residential areas and public lands.

• I demand the requirement that all chemicals used in CSG drilling or fracking must be assessed by the chemical regulator for use for that purpose before being approved.
