NSW inquiry on 'same sex marriage'

I strongly against the proposed NSW bill to legalise "same sex marriage", reasons being:

1) Marriage is a federal, not state, issue under Australia's Constitution – so a NSW bill relating to

marriage or "same sex marriage" would be invalid and unconstitutional.

2) Different state marriage laws would lead to confusion and uncertainty. Marriage issues should be

decided for the whole of Australia in the federal parliament.

3) Opinion polls with loaded or simplistic questions are not a reliable guide to public opinion. Only a

referendum, where voters receive a booklet explaining both sides, can indicate their true views.

4) Marriage recognises the committed union of a man and a woman to encourage the stable social

context needed for resulting children to be raised to responsible adulthood.

5) Mothers and fathers parent differently, and children need both approaches in order to develop a

balanced identity. That is why marriage should remain a union of a man and a woman.
