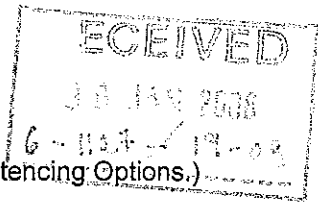

Please accept our late submission for the proposal of The Home Detention Programme commencing in June 2006. My name is [redacted] and my partner is [redacted], who is currently serving his sentence for fraud at Kirconnel Correctional Centre, NSW. [redacted] has served nearly 6 years of his sentence and is due for parole release in November 2006. I reside at [redacted] where [redacted] would be able to undertake the home detention programme for the remainder of his sentence. [redacted] is waiting to donate a kidney to his cousin and is the only compatible donor available. In his current situation it is impossible for him to have the operation due to his being under protective custody and would not be returned to Kirconnel. We feel that if he was accepted into the home detention programme he could donate the kidney and recover at home. I have a business at [redacted] and have been approved as a sponsor for his C3 classification (not yet granted). We would be pleased if you could consider our late application.
