The proposal through Midgen flat or Watsons Lane is one that is destructive ,costly, unnecessary as well as extremely damaging to the environment. It would interfere with much wildlife that resides in this area, a few of these being endangered species such as the blue wren, an icon of this district, as well as a variety of snakes and lizards who ultimately are some of the worst hit on roads and highways, the development along midgen is placed to run through a flood plane, a natural process that should not be disrupted for agricultural and environmental purposes, the small tributaries and streams that are activated during rain periods feed small patches of fragile rain forest and bushland vital to the ecology of the land. Due to clearing in the past the still remaining native vegetation is densely populated with native flora and fauna, these area's are vital for bio diversity and sustaining and already dwindling environment. Area's such as this(Mid gen Flat, Watsons Lane etc) are a delicate balance not to be disrupted. I am currently compiling a list of the endangered species living on the land and surrounding areas and will forward this on completion. These area's are sensitive to change and the proposed development would have major negative ramifications across the board.
