Submission 1

Lorraine Antonini

What is your experience of TAFE?

I have seen my husband, daughter, son-in-law and their friends retrain at TAFE as their career ideas have changed over the years. That has been one of the great things about TAFE, lifelong learning. Furthermore my mother took many arts courses over the years, gaining great satisfaction and fulfilment.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

I have only positive experiences of TAFE as previously stated above. My husband's courses made the transfer from Italy to the Australian workforce easier and faster.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

My daughter and her friends are unable to take further courses due to the greatly increased costs. They also decry the reduced hours of the courses offered and the resulting lower standards.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

The greatly increased fees obviously prevent many from enrolling. TAFE has always been regarded so highly and as an essential element in our lives at any age.

Additional comments

What has been done to TAFE is nothing short of criminal. Our TAFEs are vitally important in helping people train for work or retrain at various stages in their lives. They should never be unavailable because of costs. They are not universities only for those with money behind them or willing or able to take huge loans

Submission 3

Blair Kavanagh

What is your experience of TAFE?

TAFE was a tremendous way for me to achieve a second chance at education.

I was taught by highly competent teachers and had a great network of students to help me gain advanced IT skills.

TAFE got me work-ready in a growing employment sector and the pre-2015 fee structure was affordable, making this dream possible.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

Great teaching, hands-on learning, work-ready skills training, great network of students and teachers in our local community.

The local TAFE was an innovative IT hub, just what Australia needs, and more of!

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

2015 has seen a dramatic drop off in student numbers, it can't be a coincidence that this is the first year of the new fees structure.

Personally, I won't be able to advance from a Cert IV to a Diploma in my current course (IT) because I can't afford the new fees.

An employer has told me that he prefers to employ diploma graduates only, so in effect the new TAFE fees have limited my employment prospects.

I'm still positive about obtaining work though with my Cert IV and thankfully I achieved that before the new fees kicked in.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Debt, debt, debt. That's what the new Smart and Skilled fee structure is offering new students.

I've left TAFE debt-free but new students won't be so lucky. With mature students, this will mean debt on top of debt as they already owe HECS debts from prior study.

Additional comments

Employers are looking for competent IT workers in Australia but it seems the TAFE system won't be supplying them.

This is a poor outcome for individual students and communities, and Australia as a whole.

Submission 4

Lynette Brooks

What is your experience of TAFE?

I am a librarian, teacher and parent of 2 students who have attended TAFE.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

Everyone at TAFE from teachers to support services such as counselling and libraries together with the administration staff are high level professionals who support students to achieve their best possible outcomes in their courses. The staff at TAFE are dedicated to a high quality public education system which is responsive to the needs of all students and promotes inclusive education. TAFE does not discriminate on age nor intellectual ability, all students are supported on their learning journey by teachers who have current industry experience. My son attended the tutorial support provided for the HSC at Sutherland College and I feel confident this helped him achieve dux of his school.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

There has been an obvious reduction in numbers across the college. A once busy and thriving library has been reduced to a handful of students each day, student computers are always available where prior to these cuts a booking system was needed to ensure equity of use. A once thriving college has been reduced to a ghost town. The current reform process further threatens to reduce staff numbers and hours from courses.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Fewer people are enrolling in vocational education as the fees are too high. Students will need to work for many years to pay back the government debt, for courses which have VET fee help. Traditionally TAFE has provided education to students who do not have aspirations for university qualifications, but are more practically minded. Why have these students been subjected to university style fees, when in reality they may not achieve incomes commensurate with university graduates. Ironically they may never earn an annual income which exceeds the threshold whereby fees are repaid. Consequently, the education debt will still exist and the books will not be balanced.

Additional comments

Reinstate TAFE funding, education is not a short term proposition but a long term investment which ultimately leads to a society which has a good standard of living and a decline in social issues which result from an under educated community. Australia needs a long term vision not a short term and ineffective fix for the budget. Privatisation is not always better, private providers do not have the support services that TAFE provides and some are questionable in the quality of the course material and delivery methods used. Recent media coverage of childcare graduates from a private college exposed the poor quality and standard of training delivered. TAFE NSW should be seen as the

preferred provider of vocational education and training and funding should be reinstated immediately.

What is your experience of TAFE?

I taught at schools in Wagga for near 40 years. Tafe or as it was called then Technical Training College was newly available to boys(girls) in Wagga Wagga wanting to leave school at 14 & 9mthsto learn a trade and enter the workforce. What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

My Grandchildren have been discouraged from going to Tafe because the cost is prohibitive if you live away from home as many again have to do. Very few apprenticeships lead to a job and often the terms or as they are now called, semesters, are cut and the course cannot be followed in a sensible continuous way

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

They cannot find TAFEs providing the courses they wish to follow and costwise the incentive of an apprenticeship and a job is just not there

Additional comments

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Some courses are no longer available here. The Welding and Fitting and Turning Deptartments have closed.

Some people just don't feel able to go into debt. I'd say if they go into debt they might feel that they can't pay the debt back and it will be hanging over them for years. If the subjects are being taught here then the student will not come.

Additional comments

Smart and Skilled should be scraped. The TAFE system should be funded properly by the Government so we can all get back to providing a good Education and Training System for our Community.

Submission 9

Nerida Silver

What is your experience of TAFE?

My experience of TAFE goes back to the late 70's when I was a student studying a 2 year course in Home Economics at North Sydney. This enabled me to obtain a career in Nutrition & Dietetics in many public hospitals over a period of 18 years. In 1994 I gained casual employment as a part time teacher at Mt Druitt TAFE in the same field. As I was still employed in the Industry I brought relevant and current knowledge and information to the students. In 2001 I separated from my husband and experienced a traumatic time of property settlement and child custody which rendered me incapable of continuing to work in my field and teach. It took me a good part of 3 years to get myself back on track. In 2004, as a single parent I once again became a student at TAFE in Wentworth Falls taking on a Cert 1V in Youth Work. The following year I completed a Diploma of Community Services. In 2006 I undertook 240 hours of placement in a relative industry and gained employment with them at the completion of my student placement. I am still employed with the organisation and have been promoted into Senior Management.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

When I undertook my initial study in the late 70's the staff and training was of such a high caliber that I gained employment instantly with a well regarded teaching hospital. Again, in 2004 when I underwent a career change I experienced the same. Teacher's were extremely experienced and imparted their knowledge both practical and theoretical with enthusiasm and encouragement. As a single parent I was entitled to reduced fees which was the only way I could of continued studying at that time. This enabled me to get back into the workforce, hone my skills in this new sector, work my way up into Senior Management and put my 2 daughters through University. TAFE gave me the skills and confidence to get back into the work force and provide for my family.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

Over the last 9 years I have worked in the community sector, predominantly within a Public Housing Estate. I have personally witnessed a number of women undertake TAFE Outreach courses that were available to them as a soft entry option and free (no barriers) that have then gone on to further education and employment. This year, with the introduction of fee paying we have had a massive reduction in community members accessing TAFE Outreach. I think this says it all!!

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Community members, especially from disadvantaged backgrounds cannot afford to participate in a TAFE course. For many reason's, many of them have multiple barriers (ie: poor literacy, homelessness, DV etc) and it will take many years of encouragement and trying new skills to find their feet and confidence to embark on a career, or even seek employment.

TAFE has always been for those who are not or deem themselves to not be academics. TAFE is a nurturing, hands on way to gain skills and knowledge to obtain meaningful employment. PLEASE, stop making cuts to TAFE. It was a life line for me!!

Submission 10

Ryszard Linkiewicz

What is your experience of TAFE?

Have taught in TAFE, have had students go to TAFE

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

It allows people who have either not been to school or who have had to leave school early to get a second chance. It also gives those boys for whom school is a waste of time the chance to do something more relevant.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

The cuts are causing a huge problem for those students (mainly boys) who have to stay at school until age 17 but can't stand the place and can't see anything relevant about it. They don't want to follow the normal high school curriculum they just want to do something that will prepare them for a job. The cuts have resulted in huge discipline problems for secondary schools and a massive increase in mental health problems amongst teenage boys.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

They can't afford it. Fewer places are available. We have lots of boys who want to go to TAFE but the places just aren't available.

Additional comments

The shoddy treatment of young people by the Abbott and Baird governments should be a huge cause for concern. The only beneficiaries of these policies are the private prisons and mental health professionals.

Submission 11

Carol Wickenden

What is your experience of TAFE?

As a past student. TAFE training was above expectation the staff have not only teaching skills but more important trade experience. Bringing real life mentoring and passion to the classroom.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

I excelled at TAFE under the excellent guidance of the teachers.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I believe the subjects have less hours which means that less can be taught. Less hours less knowledge less practice = lower skill

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

The fees are too high.

Additional comments

As we know education is the key out of poverty. We need to keep career education at a realistic cost to suit low to middle income earners, so that they can grow themselves and become a valuable part of Australian community. For Australians needing financial help to pursue their career path a government loan would help them, however I believe most students work part time and we should be paying minimum eg 10% so that we are paying off the debt.

What is your experience of TAFE?

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

TAFE qualifications are gained soley by student competence. There are no financial incentives to either the organisation or staff based on student results. As such it has been a trusted source for industry training.

What is your experience of TAFE?

Early Childhood Educator

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

I loved my TAFE experience, I changed careers at 30 years of age and hadn't studied since high school. My teachers were amazing, they helped me learn how to write essays again and taught me everything about the profession I was about to enter. My teachers were dedicated and tireless and filled me with confidence which boosted my self esteem. The education I received at TAFE was invaluable when I entered the Early Childhood profession. Through TAFE I had gained the knowledge needed to be successful in my career, a career I have had for nearly 20 years.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I think it is outrageous that TAFE students are now faced with such huge fees, and with even more funding cuts to come the fees will only increase. Teachers and teaching hours are being cut and students courses are being shortened which means they are not coming into our profession with all the knowledge they should have. I know this to be true through my own work experiences. When I was at TAFE the course was two years, now the course is eighteen months. It is not possible to learn all there is to know in a shorter amount of time.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

This does not surprise me, TAFE fees are now too expensive. I could not afford to pay these fees today, as a Early Childhood Educator my income is low and it would not be enough to pay for the high TAFE fees.

Additional comments

TAFE should be free or at very least should have minimal fees. People are dropping out of trades because the fees are too high to pay. Most TAFE students enter professions that are low paid even though they have studied for two years, how can they then pay off a student debt occurred at TAFE, they can't!

Submission 15

June Smith

What is your experience of TAFE?

I got my Welfare Certificate from TAFE in 1980 when my children were teenagers, as an incentive to them to do vocational study and to prepare myself for a career after raising a family. I would not have been able to do this if TAFE had costs like today I simply wouldn't have been able to afford to. My TAFE skills meant I always had work and never cost the government any social security payments. Cheaper for government in the long term.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

TAFE gave myself and my family the skills to work in our chosen career.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I think the downgrading of TAFE is a disgrace.

TAFE is the working mans university.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Simply because RTO'S have given vocational education a bad name and taken funding out of TAFE causing fees to rise to an unaffordable level

I am now retired but occaisionaly I do voluntary work reading resumes for job applications and culling the numbers for interviews. These days employers have no confidence with training that people have done through RTO'S and instead prefer to employ people who gained their skills through a TAFE collage so they can be confident of the skills that have been taught.

Hence when I read job applications top priority is given to skills learnt at TAFE.

Submission 16

Sophie Corbett

What is your experience of TAFE?

I'm a support worker for teenaged mothers and their children

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

I have referred many young mums to introductory TAFE courses. They always receive an extrodinary level of support from the teachers and administrative staff at TAFE. Without this support many of these young women would have felt overwhelmed by the workload and have lacked the confidence in themselves to even begin studying. For women who fall pregnant in their teenaged years access to affordable flexible education can be the key to reducing their reliance on government benefits. It also works to improve their self image which means they are less vulnerable to abusive relationships and other forms of exploitation.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I have been saddened to note that since the funding cuts many of these introductory course have failed achieve minimum enrollments and have had to be cancelled.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

I have seen that the cost of these courses has been a barrier for women who are just managing to get by on a pension.

Many of the women I work with do not have much confidence in themselves in an academic sense. When the courses were free they were more prepared to give it a go and many were surprised at how well they did.

Additional comments

TAFE opened the door to financial independence and better self confidence for so many young people in the past. It is too good to loose.

Submission 17

Lyn Bevington

What is your experience of TAFE?

I was a casual TAFE teacher for 10 years and as a service manager we take TAFE community services students on placement plus we have run TAFE Outreach courses for the community

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

TAFE supports people who have many challenges, to successfully enter and complete an educational pathway eg Aboriginal, long term unemployed, socially isolated, people with a history of mental illness and women re-entering the workforce after raising children. TAFE is a very supportive learning environment. TAFE students and their teacher supervising the placement contribute greatly to community projects. Community members who have done Outreach courses which were free and therefore accessible have gone on to further study and work

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

TAFE Outreach courses have had no bookings in them since fees have been introduced as people can not afford the fees. We have had no students on group placement this year because the numbers of students enrolled have dropped significantly

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

The fees have completely put people off and it is unaffordable

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I moved out of the TAFE system prior to the funding cuts, however I'm aware that the NSW Govt. have forced TAFE to compete course by course against the private sector. This means a little backyard company which has no overheads will always come in cheaper than TAFE and therefore TAFE and students suffer as, courses are dropped in campuses were they can compete. I'm also aware that the introduction of the new computer enrolment system was not ready to be implemented when it was introduced this year and has turned the whole system of enrolment into a nightmare for both staff and potential students.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

The increased fees is a big driver. The fact that some external company's offer qualifications where students hardly have to attend classes and can gain the qualification in an incredibly short period, talk about getting your licence from a corn flakes box.

Another reason is the fact that with courses only being offered at certain campuses, distance becomes a factor.

Additional comments

Both the current State and federal Governments are going out of there way to dumb down Australia. If you have money you will go to the top universities and training schools. However if you are in the low or lower end of the middle class you will end up un-educated, your job prospects will be limited and therefore your wages reduced.

All of the above and especially the reduction of courses, increase in fees, lack of support staff, having educators and trainers on casual employment contracts, greatly effects the outcomes of those studying and the product (i.e.students)that TAFE produces. SOME RTO's courses you can just buy your qualification and the fully produced on-line courses has a fail rate of 85%. Keep TAFE open, re-establish the training courses and process it produce. A past student, a school teacher, and later a relieving Education School Director.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

Many years ago whilst a young teacher, I studied typing at TAFE. This meant I was able to produce work sheets etc for my classes and later when I studied for my drama degree and Master of Education Degree I was able to type my papers and assignments. As a relieving Education Director, I saw at first hand how students who did not fit into the schooling system were able to study as young adults for the HSC., and how others were able to mix school and TAFE courses concurrently to achieve work goals.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

Anecdotally from two young people, one an apprentice painter, a girl, said she couldn't afford the fees, and whereas once the employer of the apprentice would pay the fees, now with the burgeoning costs, this was not happening; the other a tradesman wanting to upskill, said the course he was doing was now changed, and the switch he would have to make was too expensive as he had a family to support.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

There are fewer people for two reasons from my understanding speaking to young people, namely that courses they want have been cut at their nearest TAFE on the one hand, and on the other, the courses are too expensive.

Additional comments

I live in an electorate where jobs in trades have been consistently high. TAFE gave these workers the skills. Where will the next generation of tradespeople come from, if there will be a skills shortage in the future. Obviously from overseas, whilst our youth languish on the unemployment lists because they couldn't afford or have access to the once renowned TAFE system. It seems to me that the destruction of TAFE is part of the unspoken desire of the State and Federal Liberal Party to keep the ruling classes with the money, educated with good jobs and the rest subservient - something like the old feudal system is what I have read. Locally we've seen the heavily subscribed trades course that is prized by local employers (fitting and turning etc) canned, and made available one hour and 45 minutes drive away. We've seen fees rise and seen women taking out huge personal loans so their kids can do 15 thousand dollar beautician courses without starting this humble career saddled with debt - too bad those mothers are so saddled. These are low paid workers. What is happening to TAFE is horrifying. Please, stop before it's too late.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Unaffordable debt for low paid work - however the cost incurred by these people missing out on a way to earn a living outside social security - an intergeration cost - will be felt for a century at least.

I worked there for over 30 years as a teacher and program manager. As I teacher I saw the changes in the students from entry to course completion - more confidence, more skills, better able to communicate in a business like way, more understanding of how the business world works.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I ended up as a Program Manager in a Curriculum Centre and I was made redundant as all funding for teacher/learner resources and curriculum were cut.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

The course costs are astronomical and poorer people and country folks can't afford these massive fee hikes.

What is your experience of TAFE?

Past student

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

I have studied 3 courses at TAFE, as well as a number at private training colleges. I found TAFE was far more professional. TAFE were much better with student records, consistent with RPL and the teachers were far more dedicated and experienced than those I encountered in private colleges. When people ask my advice on whether they should do their course at TAFE or at a private college, my answer is always: if you really want to learn, go to TAFE, if you just want to get the qualification as quickly as possible (irrespective of the depth of the learning experience)go to a private college because it is faster (because you learn less)and easier because everyone (and I mean everyone) always passes. TAFE is serious training, the private providers coach you to the point of spoon feeding, 'teach to the test' and the assessments are definitely easier. The hours spend in training are much less for a course of equivalent level (eg Cert IV) with the private providers and really in many cases just a 'tick and flick' - really dumbed down.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

The course fees are just too high now. I was interested in doing another Cert IV. As a mature age worker I need to ensure my skills are kept up to date. I looked at the course fees and they are over \$10,000 for the Cert IV I am interested in. This is simply unaffordable and beyond my means. It is also immoral that as a tax payer, and a person who's family has paid tax in this country for many generations, that I cannot attend government provided training to keep my skills at an optimum level. This also presents future problems, because if I were to become unemployed as a mature aged worker, the odds of my returning to the workforce are not good. This would mean the government paying more in Centrelink payments than it would have cost them to keep me in the workforce.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Firstly, it has become too expensive. Secondly, teachers and schools are not doing enough to promote it. University is seen as more prestigious and vocational training as 'second best', for those who don't make the grade. This is resulting in a serious lack of skills in essential areas such plumbers. I recently heard of someone who had to wait 3 weeks to get their toilet unblocked because the few plumbers in the area meant they could pick and choose and no one wanted a small job. For this reason plumbers earn more than many professionals, but teachers still shunt their best and brightest to areas like law etc where there is an oversupply and subtly discourage any student with any talent away from trades and 'dirty' (read blue collar) work, when it would often be in the students (and community) interest to promote such career choices. Thirdly, the apprenticeship/traineeship model is outdated. In the UK you can do courses things like upholstery,

hairdressing, painting & decorating etc via a one year intensive training course and graduate ready to open your own business. The model of doing one day a week at TAFE and four days carrying tools around or answering phones before you are certified, and earning less than the dole during this time, is simply outdated. It may suit a 17 year old living with mum and dad, but there are many mature workers who realised too late in life they would have been better off becoming a plumber than a lawyer, who cannot do that for four years. A one year intensive may be an option for many - if such an option existed.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

As a result of the funding cuts I have seen the opportunities for young people diminish. Some Trades have no course for apprentices and other trades have only 1 or 2 TAFEs in Sydney where apprentices can attend.

It has become particularly tough for regional apprentices who are on block release who often have to travel 100s if not 1000's kilometres to attend TAFE with no support from their employer and little support from the State. This has resulted in cases of apprentices having to sleep in cars and eat nothing but 2 minute noodles for a week while they attend TAFE because they have no money or their family meets this cost burden. The State has abdicated its responsibility with its current policies to provide for the quality skills needed for the future creating a race to the bottom at the expense of quality.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Apprentices are already financially disadvantaged with their low wages, this issue is exacerbated when they see their friends earning significantly more with little to know training.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

Over the next year and a half I found myself struggling, so with the help of teachers and a disability support officer, I gave myself some time and tried again.

Since 2012 I have completed three certificates and I am currently about half way through my fourth. I'm not ready to work, but I am happy to study, each day making me more employable and one hopes, a bit wiser. However I mentioned family in the first paragraph, exactly what does this mean?

My younger brother has completed FIVE TAFE certificates, three in Fine Arts and two in Horticulture and he has enrolled in another. My mother, forced to 'retire' after she was given a redundancy payout, took it upon herself to study at TAFE in her late 60s, having never completed high school.

My Mum has too much love and energy to slow down. She is onto her second certificate and she is active in the community with her volunteer work. She was nominated last year for a NSW Carer of the Year Award. She has devoted her life to improving the lives of my brothers and I, and now, with TAFE, she is helping herself to help others.

TAFE has made a MASSIVE impact on my family, so the same opportunities should exist for everyone. Everyone should have access to this great institution. Cutting funds reduces the vitality of TAFE, the services on offer, like Disability Support people, and the foundational experience that study gives.

Smart and Skilled has taken away, not given, and the thought that private institutions benefit while public education suffers is not helpful or prudent. I was a statutory officer who dealt with many industrial issues affecting TAFE and other forms of secondary and tertiary education across NSW and Australia for several decades.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

witnessed the engagement of TAFE's with industry to improve the delivery of work friendly skills accessible by lower socio income groups; above all I came to value the contribution of a wide array of lecturers and TAFE teachers with continuing experience; over time I saw the contrast emerging of the skill level and professionalism of the private sector training service providers who were more transient, more driven by profit, and often more compromised by collusive relationships with employment and social security agencies also increasingly privatised. TAFE is needed to set a hih standard of real professional and trade skills in the national interest.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I have not personally compiled a dossier of such changes but they are almost of too great a magnitude to document. Submissions tot ehe Howe Inquiry into Insecurity at work included very worthwhile in depth studies of some of those effects. One submission for staff at the Uni of NSW should still be on the ACTU website for that inquiry. There has been massive humbug for many years by Governments of all persuasions about training, substituting quantity for quality. There is an imperative need for excellence in trade and related training; there is a need for close partnership with industry but independence in the training provider; in Australia only TAFE has the range and history necessary to resource that role. Sadly, cost minimisation policies and too often venal nepotism or ideological favouring toward private service providers has consistently eroded TAFE's role and capacity.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Without accurate data I can only hazard a guess; it would be to the effect that too much of contemporary vocational education delivers inferior product; In other words, the punters know the TAFE and its private competitors are not delivering a pathway to future secure employment. For instance, training in ESL, English as a second language, was once a relatively valued and demanding credential. The proliferation of private providers, the lowering of standards and the murky scheme of collegesproviding ESL instruction to foreign students etc has seen an almost complete destruction of the status and earning power of that teaching profession. I am certain there are numerous other instances of courses and modules, ostensibly counted as vocational training, but leading to no job or no added prospects of getting secure work. The more Governments abandon the regulatory and standard setting functions and capacity of TAFE, the more they abandon responsibility for quality training to market forces that are simply not well adapted to the performance of the service delivery required by an advanced nation.

Additional comments

I have recently had reason to compare what I am told anecdotally are the standards to which Polish and Ukrainian tradespeople are trained with faq Australian tradespeople; I believe our system and output compares most unfavourably; it is narrower in scope and increasingly slipshod. Perhaps an independent and objective study should be made of what differences exist and if there are qualitative differences, the reasons for them.

The positive education experience I had at TAFE gave me the impetus for further studies and I now hold a degree in Training and Development as well as diplomas and certificates, and this had allowed my career to progress.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

My daughter is employed and is completing a traineeship in retail. The cost for this was over \$1400! It is just a Cert II! She had no money herself to pay for this so we have had to pay, which is never easy. Her elder sister completed a cert II traineeship a couple of years ago for a fraction of this cost. The people being charged these exorbitant amounts are the people least able to pay and most in need of the skills and development!

Also, in Armidale the funding cuts and lack of student numbers are obvious - hardly any cars in the car park, no students out and about. We don't have alternative providers in town, so those potential students are just missing out!

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

The costs are prohibitive. TAFE students are primarily young people and those with minimal skills - they simply can't afford to pay the fees or to get into debt through the HELP system. The subjects offered locally here in Armidale has dropped dramatically. We formerly offered graphic design, screen and media, visual arts, several IT and web courses - these all provide opportunities for self-employment or a springboard to further learning and careers. Now they are all gone and only the most basic trade courses remain. So our young people have no choice but to relocate to cities or to go without study and join the ranks of the unemployed.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

Since restructures slashed positions and TAFE NSW lost a lot of good hard working employees, put people into positions of which they had no history with or knowledge of makes it very difficult for staff to get the correct decision made. I believe there are too many managers in the system now and not enough people who actually carry out the actions of decisions or do the work that is required. Not happy with the new systems brought into place by TAFE NSW, the system has been in since 21 October 2014 and is still not working as it should. I have noticed a huge reduction in courses and so many courses having hours slashed, being put on-line now and there seems to be a lot less students in classrooms, all cost cutting in my opinion.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

I believe that the cost of courses now inhibits a lot of students from undertaking courses. TAFE NSW used to be the place where a person who could not attend university for a variety of reasons could still get an educational trade or employable qualification at a reasonable cost. It seems to me that TAFE NSW is now trying to become a university, I believe this is wrong, any wonder we are lacking in apprentices etc, it is too much.

What is your experience of TAFE?

I am a Librarian.

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

Working in the library we meet people for whom TAFE is literally life changing. These people include those who have been retrenched or women who have been out of the workforce raising children and have improved work prospects after retraining. There are also many non-English speaking migrants for whom TAFE is life line to settling in Australia not only through learning English, but also meeting people outside of their ethnic community and learning about Australian culture. TAFE has a wealth of facilities and teacher experience and expertise.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

The college where I work has seen a big drop in enrollments and some courses have been axed. Non-returning students usually cite the new fee structure as being onerously expensive. For example, a Korean man who is a recent migrant to Australia told me that he is not eligible for subsidies for his English classes at TAFE because he had attained tertiary qualifications in Korea. Under the full fee structure he would need to pay \$2000 for one day per week for a term. That is \$200 per day. This man is a 60 year old retired businessman who hoped to improve his English so as to be able to participate in the workforce here. He would have excellent skills and knowledge to contribute to Australian business sector if he had fluent English, due to his contacts and knowledge of Korean business.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

I think that the most worrying outcome of Smart and Skilled is that TAFE is reluctant to provide courses for training in the trades because of the high cost of providing tuition in those trades courses. Young people who lack the aptitude for academic theoretical learning often thrive in the trades. What will happen to those kids who have poor literacy and poor academic ability if they can't train in the trades? Will they be unable to earn a living and contribute to society and instead spend their days making trouble, filling up our jails etc? If we are not training trades people who will work in the trades? Will we need to bring in migrants to do the work?

I am a past TAFE student. I have studied a Diploma in HR (3 years part time in the evening)
Certificate IV in Workplace Assessment and Training (2 nights pw for 1 year) and a Certificate II in IT
(3 nights pw for 1 term/6 months) I studied at my local to home TAFE as I wanted to study locally with locals, there was street parking and a bus stop near by (I would drive and park near TAFE then bus it into work and bus it back again after work to attend TAFE and then drive home safely afterwards). It was a local constant in an environment where we are losing government services in our area (eastern suburbs of Sydney although is a wealthy area there are renters under financial stress who don't want to move away from their community and also we are the most densely populated area in Australia)

What are your positive experiences of TAFE?

Studying locally with that local flavour, meeting local students and making local friends. TAFE adds to building local communities and connections. I found the teachers enthusiastic and professional and of very high calibre. When I needed to make enquiries about dropping a subject due to mother and my illness they were very understanding and encouraged me to continue saying there is no cut off date so don't worry if you do have to drop a subject later on. And offered where I could do the subject the following term if I needed to. I found out at the end of the course that I was going to win the award for top of the course so I think that's also why they encouraged me to stick with it rather than delay. Each time I studied it lead to improved employment opportunities. Once I was working for an organisation that was closing so rather than waiting until it closed I preempted by studying. It helped me to be redeployed. Another time it helped me out of a career doldrum where I wasn't getting anywhere due to lack of variety of work and thus not being competitive work experience wise. It was another way of providing my skills and additional referees (TAFE teachers). For some it's been a way of making contacts to get work or progress in their work.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

I am not studying at TAFE and don't plan to due to the following issues:

Cost. Most courses start with a Cert III and it's \$6000 plus as most of us aren't covered by Smart and Skilled which I'd prefer to refer to as Dumb and Unskilled as that's what it will lead to. Many workers want to study whilst still working especially if their skills or industry is becoming outdated. To change careers workers have to start with a Cert III and add onto that. For workers on minimum wages who can barely afford to rent a boarding house room close to public transport there is no way they can find this type of \$\$\$. Also people with kids, mortagages and other commitments. Not everyone is eligible for a centrelink benefit i.e. an unemployed wife/mother.

Many courses at my local TAFE college have been discontinued. For me to study instead of driving down the street parking then travelling to my job which is 1 hour and 15 minutes away I would have

to find a TAFE somewhere that offers the course. Therefore I would have to drive. SO there are hidden costs. For example before I would drive 5-10 minutes to TAFE and 5 minutes back home costing \$1 in petrol. Now it is \$10 in petrol to and form work. \$9 parking costing \$19 per trip. Then I would have to drive somewhere else to TAFE which would be more petrol and possibly more parking and perhaps tolls so the cost of attending each night would cost me \$30 to \$40 in travel on top of the high fees plus I still need to pay for my travel by PT other days via my Opal Card. Big difference to before when it would cost \$1 per night (plus my normal weekly ticket I used anyhow which is similar cost in comparison to today) The other issue is that journey claims are no longer covered by WC so even if I am approved as a student by work (they are usually happy to when not paying any other costs or benefits in relation to my study) I'm not covered should something happen. So I am reluctant to do all that driving or travel late at night.

TAFE in the eastern suburbs of Sydney sits on prime land so developers and the state govt are probably keen to sell it off to make money. Hence probably why it's being run down so it can be closed

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Cost

Reduction in location where courses are held so that people have to travel further from home/work, to places where there are parking costs so additional costs of travel on top of this

Also lack of availability of desired course at desired time

Additional comments

I've seen private colleges offer diplomas that only go for 9-15 days and wonder how this can be equivalent. Also which private colleges despite being accredited do employers recognise. People could pay all this money to find that the course isn't recognised by employers. Some colleges don't offer evening courses, where do they think people get the money to pay for these courses. It's about skilling up our workforce to meet current and future economy needs not about making people pay for the privilege of getting a job/promotions. Employers need skilled labour, employees need skills. Showing you are keen and motivated is not enough. For disadvantaged for example working sole parents, they have had so much cut from them that when their kids grow up they need to concentrate on securing their own future rather than pay hefty fees for their kids education.

In relation to the eastern suburbs of Sydney. Over the past 25 years we have lost 2 TAFE (North Bondi and East Sydney), Legal Aid, Medicare Offices. There is threat of Privatising St Vincents Hospital. We have no govt accredited relationships counselling organisations (there are some in the city but as they serve city workers they can't offer beginning or end of the day appointments to people living in the eastern suburbs who don't work in the city. It may be argued that we are a wealthy area but we are also an extremely highly populated area therefore when providing a local service the ratio of the population to number of service providers is high. For example 1 Legal Aid to 250,000 people is equivalent to the 8 that cater for the Greater Western Sydney which has a population of 1.9m. Purely basing services in the CBD mean that we are competing against city workers from all parts of Sydney for services and this is our only option whilst elsewhere they have local options as well.

When I first left school in 1977 TAFE was the only college that offered me the chance to get a vocational education. My family was very poor and without the great TAFE system at the time, I would probably have ended up working in a factory or shop as a unskilled worker. Since that time, TAFE has offered courses to my community, my family and friends and myself that have enabled us to have an affordable qualification so that we could enter the Australian workplace. TAFE qualifications were always well regarded by employers.

What are your experiences of funding cuts to TAFE?

The local TAFE is now a ghost town. The very large campus in SW Sydney is now empty. Half of the staff are gone. Courses can only be offered if there are enough students, the fees are very high. The most concern I have and others I work with have is that the private colleges are offering expensive, low quality education and is not well regarded by industry.

In the long run the taxpayers will pay for the blow-out in private education costs that will be deferred on the tax system. If students can't find a job when they complete the private courses, the cost will be incurred by the States.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Vocational education has been downgraded in importance. The push for students to enter universities is the current trend. Many apprentices, like my son, have experienced insecurity in the jobs, therefore they can't continue vocational education if they're not employed. My son is now 27. He had enough of the bullying, low pay and constant job searching because unscrupulous employers wanted to and have taken advantage of young trainees and apprentice by not paying them their dues & exploiting. He is now working for the army. I believe this is the reason that numbers have fallen. The government needs to investigate small business providers and their shonky recruitment, training and payment practices.

The TAFE was hamstrung by cuts to it's budget. I'm sure we are not the only trade taking hits like this.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

I think there has been a push away from vocational education numbers due to the fact our current government would like everyone to go to university and pay for everything themselves. This would save the government millions and help it get to that magic surplus its looking for. This is why the TAFE system has been cut to bare minimum.

Unfortunately you don't get good print trade workers or diesel mechanics from universities.

This is why the trades are in such desperate need of well trained new people and why industries are crying out for good tradies.

I also believe the TAFE system is a reliable system with checks and balances that ensure well rounded trades, managers and other vocations are met for the current job market. I'm not sure of the credentials of a lot of private training groups. I have experienced a couple of these, and while they say their training and student education is at the top of their priorities I have experienced a

TAFE provides opportunities for young and mature age people as well as students whose gifts lie in technical rather than academic areas. Not everyone can or should go on to University and TAFE used to provided affordable educational opportunities in numerous rural and regional areas so that students don'ts have to leave their local area to learn.

Dapto TAFE, in the Illawarra area has been terribly badly affected and student numbers have dropped alarmingly. The teachers (past colleagues) who remain in TAFE have sustained such savage cuts to their training areas that many are dispirited and close to calling it quits. The feeling seems to be that the government wants to kill off TAFE and basically privatise the entire training system.

Why do you think fewer people are enrolling in TAFE?

Fees are exceptionally high, teaching services have been cut, support services cut. Many industries have sought to lower training standards and cut course duration and content in order to gain only the narrow skills that specific industry wants - in other words, industry has is not interested in a broadly and diverse skilled workforce.
