Submission to Coal Seam Gas Enquiry

Given the amount of global and local knowledge about the environmental effects of coal seam gas extraction, it seems to me that it simply must not be allowed anywhere near productive farmland or, more importantly, areas of both important aquifers and surface water here in Australia.

It is well known that Australia is the driest content on earth and we simply cannot afford to allow any threat to our water supplies. Nor should we allow the apparent disregard for our "food bowl" areas to continue.

In my case, I live in the Southern Highlands of New South Wales, an area of significant water resources (both surface and subterranean) which supply not only our local area, but also the vast metropolis of Sydney. To even consider allowing Planet Gas or any other CSG extraction company the right to even explore this area seems ludicrous.
