As President of Griffith Business Chamber I am pleased to make this submission on behalf of our region.

Griffith is the Regional Capital to Western Riverina region and serves all the communities for around 180km around Griffith city location.

It is the fundamental right of all Australians everywhere in Australia to have access to face to face highest quality education. There should be no disparity between City or Country in the quality & availability of education.

Travelling time for students to get to and from school on safe accessible routes means that it is the obligation of Government to provide facilities in our view no more than 40 minutes each way from the students home.

We understand the need for time to time review with population shifts etc. but do not believe that these decisions can be made on a purely black & white commercial basis as the ramifications to community breakdown are difficult to measure & can have dyer consequences to our region. It is therefore essential that subsidization apply in many cases.

In the Riverina we have recently seen the closures of Mangoplah, Crestview, Gumly Gumly and Griffith Region - Grong Grong, Bilbul, Murrami schools and we are concerned that true community consultation & a whole of community consideration was not applied when these closure decisions were made. We ask that a better approach be implemented before making further decisions that may impact our communities.
