Impact of CSG on the Hunter Valley tourism industry.

The Tourism industry in the Hunter valley represents a \$1.8 billion dollars per year industry. It is built upon the attraction of the region particularly its wineries, and its close proximity to Sydney. On this building block has flowered a whole support industry comprising hundreds of small businesses involved in Hospitality, food, accommodation tourism attractions and support activities.

This industry has developed over the past 150 years, and now is the major employer in the region employing thousands of people.

The advent of CSG mining to the area will destroy the attraction of the area. Tourists come to see vines wineries and tourism facilities, not CSG wells, pipelines, Gas tanks, compressor stations, saline ponds for returned water, that will destroy the attraction of the area.

There is no economic value to be gained for the people of NSW by allowing CSG mining in the vineyards area.
