Their submission is professional and detailed. Their arguments are compelling.

The Ballina Environment Society supports the present Pacific Highway route as the most sensible choice.

If there is a significant reason why it has not been included we would appreciate the information about it.

It is clear that route 2C is the least suitable option on every count.

The main points that the Blackwall Highway Action Group submission has made about that route are worth reiterating. They are:

- ∞R oute 2C contains the largest areas of old growth forest in the Lower Richmond Valley
- ∞ Route 2C contains habitat for numerous threatened species and endangered ecological communities
- ∞ Route 2C contains the largest Koala populations in the region
- ∞ R oute 2C will destroy rain forests, we tlands, heath lands, saltmarsh, swamp forest and a range of eu calypt forests

Route 2F is the preferred option if the present Pacific Highway is deemed unsuitable.as it does not require the clearance of any native vegetation or any impacts upon biodiversity
