Public transport is inadequate and forces most families to have two or more vehicles as their children need to get to tertiary education or employment. If new areas are developed there should be improvements to roads, rail etc developed at the same time to cope with the extra influx of people and cars. This is poorly lacking and governments should be ashamed.!!! The Windsor Road debacle ramains very clear in our minds and you have to wonder what means we will have to go to to be heard.
