Issues with Government and how it affects agriculture

1. Caged Layer Egg Industry

 Decided by the ARMCANZ to move to more welfare friendly cages by

a.Key Stakeholders

- State and Federal Ministers of Agriculture only one of who now,
 7 years later, still holds that portfolio
- o Welfare, liberationists and industry

b.Key components - due January 2008

- o Bird Space moved from 450 to 550 cm per bird
- o 20 years of life to produce from, from the date of installation
- o Make non compliant cages illegal
- o Appropriate punitive legislation in place

c.Progress

- o To date Queensland, ACT, Tasmania Northern Territory have legislation in place and now Victoria has softer legislation
- Now with the Equine Influenza outbreak, all resources are being put to it and this will probably further delay the legislation.
- I have a development application approved and need to have this legislation in place to order cages from Europe by the 1st November 2007.

What have our elected representatives delivered for us??

1989 - Complete deregulation of a production and marketing system in NSW – followed by most other states

Paid back \$15.00 /bird and acquired all statutory assets
Made producing at non market locations a competitive disadvantage
Tamworth in 1989 had 1 million birds equating to 20% of state
production —

Now has 400,000 birds equating to 8% of state production beyond 2008 probably 100,000-250,000 equating to 4% or less of state production

2008 – National Cage legislation that is non uniform, and in NSW is still pending

Environmental Impact requirements – again non uniform between the states e.g.

- o NSW for less that 240,000 birds only requires an S.E.E.... More than 250,000 requires an E.I.S.
- Victoria is much larger that that

GST

- Thanks to Meg Lees of the Democrats we have no GST on food products that require no further processing
- Outcomes the egg industry pays GST on all imputs and receives no GST on revenues of sale of eggs
- Results in my business with an egg turnover of approx \$1.2
 m, I require another 10,000 per month to finance it
- Also need to do BAS monthly to minimize this capital requirement
- > Tamworth used to have a cage manufacturing industry now we have to import from Europe, America or China
- For the new cages I intend to install, 8 people will come from Malaysia and fully install the cages over 8 weeks more cost effectively than I can employ local labour
- ➤ With the lock up of the Brigalow, I am now unable to procure soft wood shavings for deep litter chicken rearing. These were by products of the local sawmilling industry.
- ➤ Now shedding is fully environmentally controlled what guarantee do I have of the power grid not failing next summer and beyond power base loads requirements are already not coping
- Stamp Duty State revenue is an outrage
- ➤ Intergenerational transfer exemption has been the only good decision this government has made on this issue.
- > Fire Services Levy
- > Insurance Premiums
- ➤ Water infrastructure the upgrade of Chaffey Dam is most welcome
- ➤ Indirect Labour Costs

Workers compensation, Leave Loading

- > OH & S the responsibility for employee behaviour who does it lie with?
- ➤ Litigation
- > Rego/ Roadworthy now
- > Rego for farm vehicles
- > Lack of students studying agriculture
- > Lack of investment in the country/regional infrastructure
- > Absolute costs of investments
