Like so many in our community I am strongly opposed to a NSW Bill to legalise same sex marriage.

Marriage is a federal, **not State** issue under the Australian constitution.

Selective opinion polls are not necessarily a reliable guide for the whole of society's opinion. Only a clearly explained National referendum can indicate the true views across all of Australian society.

In any case there are grave concerns about the repercussions of such a law. If love becomes the utmost qualifying factor for marriage, then what is to stop polygamy, or marrying a relative, or even a child further down the track, if love is also present in these cases? Also, in countries such as Canada that have legalised same sex marriage, religious ministers have been forced to marry same sex couples against their conscience, and face serious legal ramifications if they refuse.
