Please find listed below my response to the above submission where you request submissions from then public.

- 5 As a natural born Australian, whose families have always worked and paid taxes I would expect my Government to educate my children in the best possible way, giving them every chance of succeeding in life. Just because my son has Dyspraxia I would not expect my Government to just ignore this problem, they may be able to brush it under the carpet, but as a mother I cannot do that. By not offering my son John McKee the help he needs in his education to be able to succeed in the best possible way you are "robbing" him of a normal adult life. I would therefore expect my Countries Government to offer every possible assistance, as advised by his teachers, to help John in any way with his schooling. There are suitable curriculums available he just needs help to be able to complete them. Sarah Redfern Public School staff have already made you very aware of what my son needs with a visit to Parliament House on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2009.
